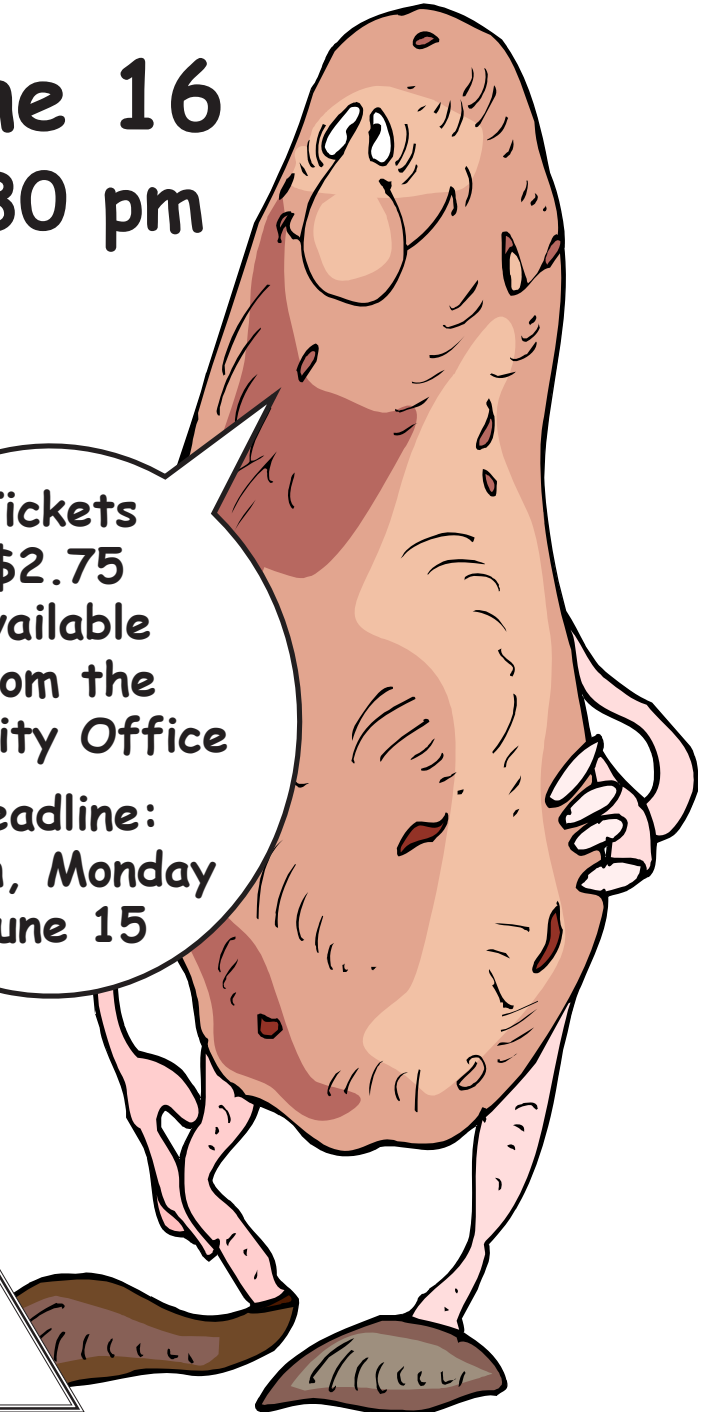

RULES! RULES! RULES!

Why is it necessary to have so many rules? Rules are developed to establish standard procedures for utilization of the facilities that are provided for everyone's use. They are intended to provide a safe and healthful environment for owners, renters, and guests of Venture Out.

The Rules that apply to the use of VO facilities are not the Condo Board's Rules; they are the Owner's Rules. Each and every one of us has a responsibility to follow the rules and to encourage others to do the same. We will always have individuals that feel certain rules do not apply to them and, on occasion, claim not knowing the rule when approached about their actions that may be in violation of one or more rule(s). We all have a responsibility to inform others when we observe violation of "OUR RULES."

There are issues that occur that generate responses from Administration and/or the Condo Board Members. A recent situation involved the placement of drinks and snacks near the water at the West Pool. Swimming Pool Rule #9 states that no food or drink is to be placed within ten (10) feet of the pool or hot tubs. WHY? There are health and safety issues associated with foreign and unexpected items in this traffic area. As we become more senior, one of our faculties that has a tendency to fail us is our eye sight. Those with glasses frequently remove them when they are in the pool area. This contributes to less ability to observe items that could interfere with their ability to use the area near the pool and injury may occur. LIABILITY? If our rules are not enforced, that shows acceptance of not following the rule. When this occurs and someone is injured due to the actions of others, legal issues could happen and who is to blame? We all know the cost of frivolous law suits and it is in our best interest to avoid them if at all possible, they cost us money.

We ask for your cooperation in following "OUR RULES" and reminding others to do the same. If you feel a rule is not fair or is no longer needed, prepare a request to the Governing Document Committee with your recommendation to add, edit, or remove the rule and why this action should be considered. Thanks for your consideration and support and continue to enjoy the fine facilities available at Venture Out.

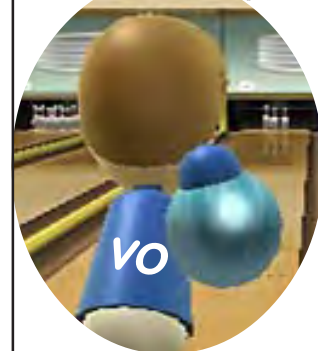

SOMETHING FREE AND FUN!

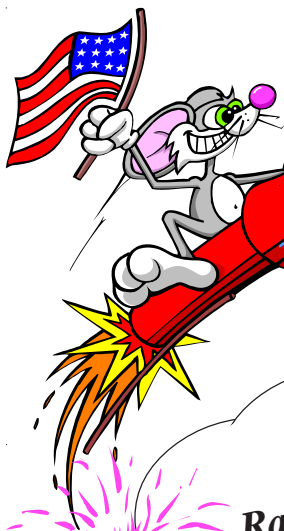

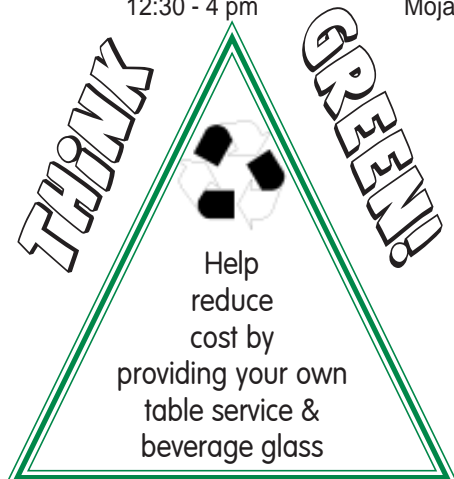

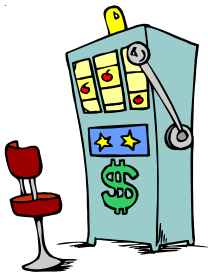

Occupancy this month is 318 or 18% vs. 651 the month prior and 381 the year prior.

When the residents leave Venture Out, the staff just changes hats and starts working on the many summer projects that were approved at budget time. This year we have many projects that have begun early as they are reserve items, or they were still funded in this year's budget. Some items in progress or completed at this time are as follows:

The Annex Roof has been completely replaced. The lawn bowling court # 2 is in the process of being rebuilt. The shuffleboard shade structure is installed. The Community Center walkway and deck is in the process of being re-coated. The storage building for Recreation/tennis is now at the city for approval and permitting. The sewing room expansion is at the City for permit approval. A valley gutter will be installed the length of Fairchild to control the water runoff down this principal drainage path. The SE storage area will be repaired; seal coated and re-stripped slightly differently to better accommodate the larger RV rigs that we are now seeing. Electrical work is being done on the fitness center, which will also be painted and re-carpeted prior to the receipt of the new weight equipment. Palm trees will start to be trimmed on June 15th. These are all the projects that we are trying to complete in this fiscal year. Another large batch of projects will begin after July 1 at the start of the new fiscal year.

We are still in the process of design review with the City for the two large projects of the front Entryway and the RV Pullthroughs. Once the City has signed off on the preliminary design, the Architect will complete hard drawings. These drawings will then be bid out to determine what the actual costs would be in the event that the Board opts to tackle either one of these projects this summer. In talking to several knowledgeable people in the industry; I am told that many architectural firms are actually laying off staff these days. The term in the industry is: "the pipeline is empty", as very few new projects are being considered. We are hopeful this will translate into some very competitive bidding for these projects.

The Board met recently and reviewed a request for a variance from the pool rules, to allow water bottles at the edge of the pool, instead of the ten foot setback. The Board considered this, but decided against the variance as they feel that encouraging items to be along the pool/spa edges would be a potential trip and fall hazard and should not be allowed. They felt that the ten foot setback rule was reasonable and needs to be followed. There is an article in this month's Out-Lines regarding this.

We have had some residents misunderstand the new amendments which were passed this year regarding underage visitation. The change allows residents to have underage guests stay elsewhere on the property **WHEN THE RESIDENT IS IN RESIDENCE** and not to exceed 28 days. It is **NOT POSSIBLE** for your underage guests or relatives to use your home in your absence. Underage **OWNERS**, do have the right to use their unit for a total of 28 days in any calendar year. We have had some underage people show up at Venture Out expecting to use a family members unit, much like a time share or a hotel and they are turned away. This can really spoil someone's planned vacation and cause major problems here in the office, so please don't do this!

Watch for your summer packets, which will have the annual summer newsletter, pictures of work in progress and of course your coupon books. This packet will be mailed out the first week of June.

Have a wonderful summer and think of us when it hits 116° degrees!

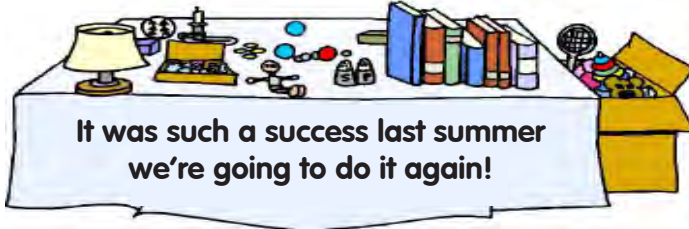

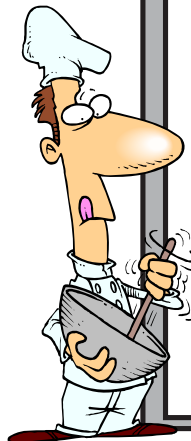

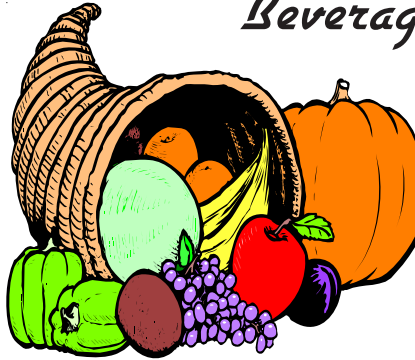
