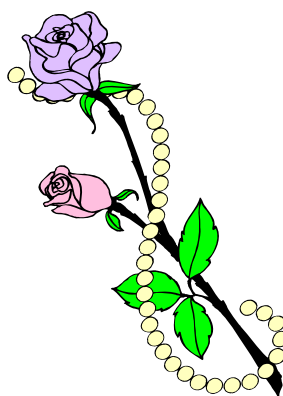

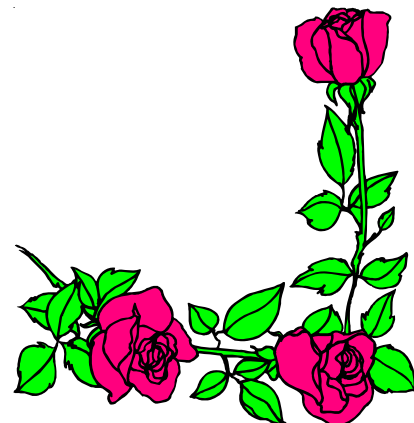

Manager's Corner

May, 2010

This month's occupancy is 577 or 33% vs. 1339 last month and 547 the prior year. There are 46 renters in the park.

Construction season has started at VO. The Front Entry/ RV Overnight project is well underway. Traffic is entering off of Higley with few complications at this point. Security is based out of the Oasis building and staff (for the moment) is working under a tent between the two lanes. We will see how this fares as things heat up, but for right now they actually enjoy it. We are going to add some painted arrows to guide people in and out of the property from the Admin Office area and the Community Center. To further guide our visitors through the property maze we are adding a large piece of cheese over the Higley Gate. (Just kidding!)

As they work in the RV Overnight area, the heavy equipment has caused a few water line breaks. We are putting in a temporary water feed to the Laundry room and the Admin Office so this area can be completely shut down.

As soon as it is practical, we will install the new gate system on the Broadway gate. This will enable us to work through the summer with the year-round residents and refine the system. Watch for information this June through the summer newsletter and possibly an additional mailing that will outline the procedures for 'check in' this next fall. As I said before, this new system will be very comparable to Leisure World and your guests or vendors will need to be authorized by the lot owner or we will have to try to locate you before allowing them admittance. This should be very effective in helping us keeping unwanted visitors out of the park. A guest list for each resident/lot will be kept on the computer in the guardhouse. Computer savvy lot owners can manage their own guest list adding or deleting at will. Those that are not computer literate will be able to provide us with their lists and we will input them on the computer. There will also be a voice authorization system to call in and verify short notice guests or vendors. There will be more information on this, in the summer newsletter, so stay tuned; we think you will like this additional security feature.

SRP is projecting that they will start to replace transformers sometime between May 10th – 17th. We will notify lot owners when each transformer is expected to be down. They said to anticipate that they could be down for more than likely 1 – 3 hours, but they could be down as much as 8 hours. The Sonoran Café will be set up as a resident lounge for all residents affected by this. During the heat of the summer, you can bring your pets to this area, but please keep them confined in this room and on a leash or in a carrier.

We also want to give our residents a huge THANK YOU, for clearing the easements. It's just amazing out there. For the first time ever, you can look up and down behind units and in many cases walk the entire block. This is a huge improvement for the utility workers and staff that have to operate back there. Don't forget to contact the ADMIN office if you need irrigation lines tapped off.

The Tennis/Bocce project is still in the Preliminary Design review. We have made a few adjustments per the City. The biggest issue was adding some additional underground water retention storage, (like they do in shopping center parking lots), but we were not required to pave the entire lot, so we hope this will be a wash when we go to bid. The City will still have to do the formal Plan Review after the Preliminary Plan Review. There are a lot of steps when you go through the City for approval of projects of this nature.

The Recreation/Tennis Storage buildings were completed and they are some very nice storage facilities.

The West Pool bathhouses likewise are under design now. In order to not trigger a major plan review on this facility we try to keep the work under the scope of "repair," meaning we stay within the original envelope of the structure and try not to move any doors, windows etc. What goes on inside is another matter, as it will be completely gutted and not very recognizable when it's put back together. It will be fully ADA compliant (handicapped accessible) for toilets, sinks and showers. The architect is working on both of these projects trying to get them into the city as quickly as possible. Thanks to the morning exercise groups who all gave input on the design and their wants and needs for this facility.

I want to thank Harold and Jean Scott for generously donating a year old refrigerator to this office. When Scotty asked me if we would like the refrigerator I, of course, accepted, but I had no idea how nice this refrigerator would be and I am just blown away by their generosity.

If you are leaving, drive carefully and we will see you next Fall.

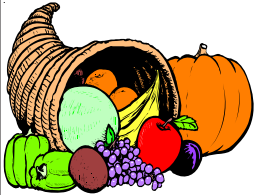

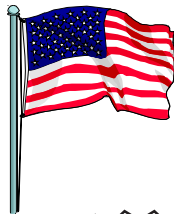

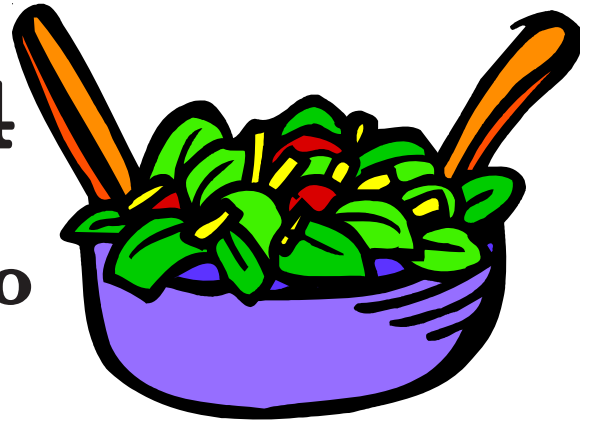
