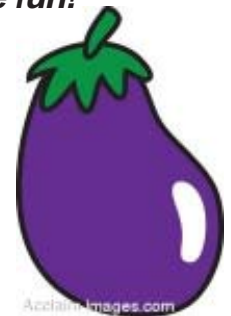

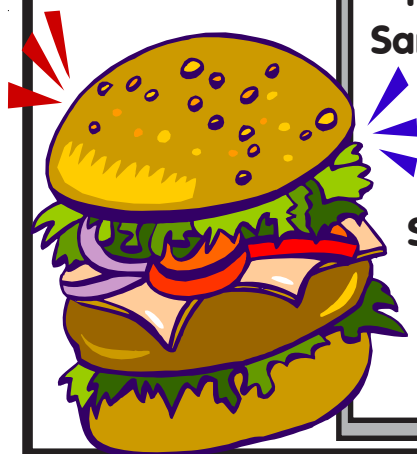

Manager's Corner

July, 2010

This month's occupancy is 191 or 11% vs. 357 last month and 190 for the year prior.

Work on the Front Entry and RV overnights is progressing rapidly. Residents on site are having the pleasure of waking up every morning at 5:30 when construction begins. At this time the front guardhouse is totally framed in and is currently being plumbed and fitted for the HVAC (Heating Ventilation and A/C). The new gate posts are installed and the actual gates will be about the last thing to go in. I wrote about this before, but want to repeat it; the major change at the front entry that most will see is that the entry has been raised considerably in order to deflect the rain water from the city streets flowing through the property. For years this has been a major problem for VO as we were basically handling a lot more storm water through the property than we should be. At times the guardhouse would actually have water flowing through it as it rushed in off the street. The guards were good sports about it and referred to the rushing water as "their water feature", but of course water flooding into the guardhouse was not a good thing.

The pads for the RV's are being poured and we should also start the paver work next week. We are fortunate that so much of this work is concrete as concrete prices have remained low and by contrast, the oil crisis is causing asphalt prices to increase, now making concrete less than asphalt!

The Bocce/Tennis and Bathroom projects (also the majority of which is concrete) are with the City now for approval. Both projects completed preliminary approval. The architect felt he addressed all the issues that were raised with city on Tennis/Bocce and so he hopes it moves quickly now on this final stage. The actual construction of these two projects is expected to be eight to ten weeks, so we are keeping our eye on that timetable. These projects will go out to bid this next week.

Palm tree trimming is starting. It's always a mess and I always encourage on site residents to take a vacation if they can and get away from the 'war zone' that VO becomes while we try to do all these large projects simultaneously.

All RV spaces from January through March are leased and we are working now on filling the shoulder season. There is much excitement expressed by our RV overnight renters at the prospect of returning next year to these all new spaces.

Residents will also note that there is much more landscaping at the front entry. The city has a requirement that landscaping must be a specific percentage of any project. We are at the minimum that the City allows, but for VO it will look lush, compared to the way the entry was prior.

We continue to post regular photos on the web site to keep everyone up to date. You will find the link for the photos at the top of the web site.

In the next month, please watch for a special envelope with will be marked with "Entry Gate information/Important". **DON'T THROW THIS AWAY.** It will include instructions on how you access the gate site on the internet and set up your personal guest list. Anyone who is not computer literate will find a sheet inside this mailing in which you can fill out your guest information and return to our office and we will input the information for you. This will also be the time to update your emergency contact information. Every year we find that phone numbers have been changed and no longer are operational. Now residents can go on line and update important emergency information contacts as often as they need to.

For people who are computer oriented, this gate system will put at your finger tips, the ability to manage who is allowed in to see you, any vendor you may have called to come, regular service people such as home care providers etc. As I said before, this system now will be very similar to Leisure World. You will have to have your guests pre-authorized to enter the property. By putting down all of your guests in advance, this should run smoothly. We will also schedule some monthly orientation sessions on how to operate the gate system until we know that everyone is well versed on it.

We hope you are all having a wonderful summer, we have not yet hit the searing temperatures down here, but they are coming.



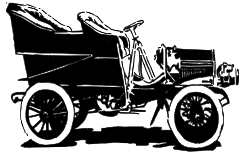

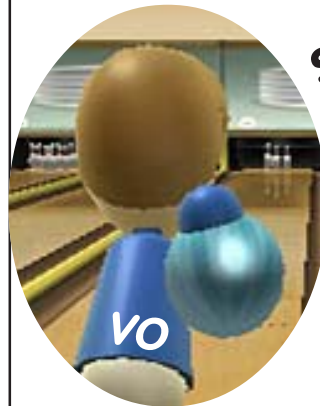

“VO Annex” provides a signal to the Auxiliary Ballroom area.

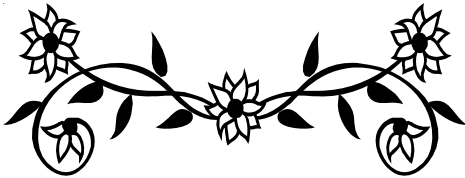
